

Denmark Warns the United States to Respect Its Sovereignty as Trump Names Greenland Envoy

Denmark has issued a firm diplomatic message to the United States, emphasizing the importance of respecting Danish sovereignty following reports that former U.S. President Donald Trump has named a special envoy focused on Greenland. The move has reignited international attention on Greenland's strategic importance and raised sensitive questions about territorial integrity, diplomacy, and Arctic geopolitics.

This development highlights ongoing tensions between national interests and global strategic ambitions, particularly in the Arctic region, which is becoming increasingly significant due to climate change, natural resources, and military positioning.
